Fast Facts about Allerton and the IMACC Conference

- Allerton House is the site of the IMACC Annual Conference. Built as a private home by Robert Allerton in 1900, it was developed into a conference center in 1946. It is located just west of Monticello, IL and is part of the University of Illinois system. More information (including directions) can be found at <http://www.continuinged.uiuc.edu/allerton/>.
- Lodging rooms for the annual IMACC Conference are located in the Main House, the Evergreen Lodge, the Gate House and the Little House in the Woods. Room configurations have changed this year. Quarters are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. There is very limited space for spouses, and the conference is not designed for, nor do the facilities adequately accommodate children.
- There is wireless internet access for all of the first floor, and possibly all of the main house by conference time.
- Conference meals are preplanned by the Conference Coordinator. Special dietary needs can be accommodated if you contact the Conference Coordinator by March 2, 2009. Snacks are served throughout the day and evening, and publishers are present with textbooks on display for your perusal. Publishers also usually donate towards our evening social hours. All amenities are included in the registration fee.
- Attire has been somewhere between corporate casual and unkempt. You may want to bring: an umbrella (spring rain, some buildings not connected), hiking shoes, and a camera.
- There is no evening meal on Thursday night so plan accordingly.
- There will be a couple of computers with internet access, FAX and printer available.
- In years past, some participants prefer to stay in downtown Monticello; there is a block of rooms reserved until March 7, 2009. Be sure to state that you are with the IMACC conference. Rooms cost \$85.99 + tax per night. [217-762-9436]
- No matter where you stay off-site, you must make your own reservations. Please, indicate **no lodging** on your reservation form if you are not staying at Allerton.

Do You Know the Way to Allerton?

- 1.) Turn off Interstate 72 at Monticello exit 164 onto Bridge Street. Turn left (south) off of the ramp and drive towards Monticello. Turn right (west) at the first crossroads, which will be old Route 47.
- 2.) Travel approximately 2 miles west on old Route 47 and turn left (south) onto County Road 625E, located just past the brown "Allerton Park and Conference Center" sign.
- 3.) Continue on County Road 625 E for approximately one mile. At the stop sign, turn right (west) onto County Farm Road.
- 4.) Turn left (south) onto the first road you come to, which will be Old Timber Road, and go through the brick columns. Follow signs to main parking lot to the left. Conference Center guests may park in the main lot and follow signs to the Conference Center.

IMACC 2009 Conference General Session Speakers

(subject to change)

Friday Morning Opening Session – *Statistical Literacy and Thinking*. This session is sponsored through the AMATYC Introductory Statistics Traveling Workshop. The workshop itself has been developed from the 2008 AMATYC Summer Institute “GAISEing Beyond the Crossroads: Improving Instruction in Introductory Statistics” and it will focus on the implementation of the Guidelines for Assessment and Instruction in Statistics Education. This workshop is sponsored by CAUSE with funding from NSF. The opening session is a general interest session for all conference attendees, focusing on developing definitions for statistical literacy and thinking and applying these definitions to examples of desired student behaviors. Presenters are Brian Smith, McGill University, Montreal, and Mark Earley, Bowling Green State Univ, Ohio, for both the opening session and workshop.

IMACC conference attendees interested in attending the AMATYC Introductory Statistics Workshop should sign-up by March 2, 2009 to participate in four one-hour sessions on Friday, - two following the opening session in the morning and two in the afternoon. Most of these sessions will occur during IMACC concurrent or break-out session times. This workshop will be limited to 25 people.

The topics covered during the four sessions will be “Using Real Data,” in which participants work through illustrative exercises designed to allow students to become active participants by solving authentic problems, and “Conceptual Understanding,” in which participants work through examples that develop and enhance conceptual understanding, an emphasis of GAISE, for key topics such as variability and its relationship to the shape of a distribution.

Attendees are strongly encouraged to bring a laptop computer. Wireless internet access is available at Allerton and will be used. Participants will be IMACC conference attendees who have registered and paid for attending the 2009 IMACC Conference at least on Friday. This conference registration is done through Diane Martling, Conference Coordinator, using the IMACC registration form. Reservations for attending the workshop should also be done by March 2 by marking the appropriate lines on the same IMACC registration form.

IMACC is very pleased to be able to include this professional development opportunity with the 2009 Conference. Instead of you having to travel to the workshop, the workshop is coming to you! Participants will be expected to attend all sessions of the workshop and to complete a survey before and after the workshop. Friday Afternoon General Session - *Lively Applications to Introduce College Algebra and Precalculus Topics* by Revathi (Reva) Narasimhan, Kean University, Union, New Jersey. What do E-bay, the Subaru Outback, Verizon and Yosemite National Park all have in common? They all form contexts in which many types of functions in college algebra and pre-calculus can be studied. Making the connection between mathematics and the real world is one of the more challenging aspects of teaching. This session will illustrate new and interesting mathematical applications that are relevant to today’s students. Flexible use of graphing calculators and spreadsheets will also be discussed. Handouts will be provided.

Friday Evening Session – *I’ve Tried EVERYTHING So You Don’t Have To* by Alan Bass, San Diego Mesa College, CA. Serving as the project leader for the Math Study Skills intervention portion of the NSF-funded Pathways through Algebra project, Bass mentored five schools into different types of Study Skills programs. He will share some things that different schools have tried and what has worked (or failed). Additionally, he will explore the material he has collected to help schools start a Study Skills program.

Saturday Morning General Session - *Simplify the Difficult: Start with the Basic Skills* by Sherri Messersmith, College of DuPage. Introducing new topics like solving formulas for a specific variable and simplifying radicals can scare students because they “look hard”. Concrete examples of how we can make connections between basic skills and new ones for better student understanding and less math anxiety will be given addressing polynomial long division, solving formulas for a specific variable, rational expressions, radicals, the quadratic formula, and equations in quadratic form. Handouts will be provided.

Saturday Morning Closing General Session – *The Keystone Method of Instruction in Basic Mathematics: Theory, Practice, Results, and Future*, Dr. Vali Siadat, Richard J. Daley College, Chicago, *recipient of the MAA 2009 Deborah and Franklin Tepper Haimo Award of Distinguished Teaching of Mathematics*. This is the first time a community college faculty member has received this prestigious award and we are most pleased to have him speak. Co-Presenters: Dr. Eugenia Peterson, Dr. Cyrill Oseledets, Dr. Ming- Jer Wang. The Keystone method is a synergistic system of assessing students’ learning and adjusting of teaching practices. The teacher expresses his/her expectation and standards, and students demonstrate their learning and knowledge of the topics through this medium. The results, based on a large sample, have shown dramatic improvements in student performance and retention in these classes. They will provide handouts and actual copies of some of the quizzes.
